International Academic Programs (IAP), a unit of the [International Division](#), leads campus efforts to provide credit-bearing academic experiences worldwide for UW–Madison students from diverse backgrounds in all majors and academic levels. IAP works in close partnership with study abroad offices within the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences and the Wisconsin School of Business as well as with academic departments across campus to offer programs specifically designed for their students.

It's hard to imagine the difference a few years make! Study abroad, like so many facets of our lives, has returned with a vibrancy as almost all COVID-related restrictions have eased. After over a year of travel suspensions (2020-21), we are again at record setting levels and have rebounded faster than many of our peer institutions. Student participation in 2022-23 (2,551) is almost 40% higher than the previous year, and 16% higher than the previous record set in 2019 (2,190). 2023-24 participation rates are on track to significantly outpace the record set this previous year and we anticipate participation continuing to increase due to: larger overall student body, the lifting of most pandemic-related restrictions, the re-opening of the majority of our programs, and the development of vibrant new programs.

We now offer 325 opportunities in over 80 countries worldwide: from a focus on access with the [UW Global Gateway Initiative](#), [first year student initiatives](#), [School of Education Global Initiatives](#), or our new partnership with [International Internships](#), to our continuing partnerships with [College of Agricultural and Life Sciences](#), the [College of Engineering](#), and the [Wisconsin School of Business](#). As always, we strive to offer programs that allow student to advance on their academic path; our ever-growing resource of [Major Advising Pages](#), completed with academic departments across campus, highlight the paths to do so.

One of our goals this year is developing our [domestic study away portfolio](#), including our signature [Wisconsin in Washington Program](#), as a way to increase students' access to high-impact educational experiences and explore domestic issues of vital importance.

Our commitments to [DEI](#) initiatives, [sustainability](#) initiatives, and [student support](#) continue to guide our work, as does our collaborations with partner offices across campus, as we strive together to support campus goals.

One of the exciting developments this year has been welcoming the [International Internship Team](#) into IAP. We are delighted to help make international internships more visible and accessible to undergraduate Badgers within the full portfolio of high-quality IAP global experiences. They are poised to offer more opportunities globally to more students than ever in the coming year.

Our new [Early Bird Scholarship](#), offers students assured funding prior to applying to progress to help students with financial need access our programs and encourage earlier financial planning.

Many more exciting new programs are on the horizon for 2024-25 as we continue to strive to provide off-campus life-changing academic experiences for Badgers of all majors.

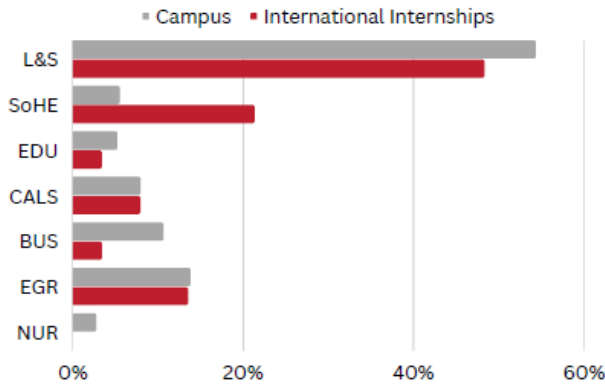

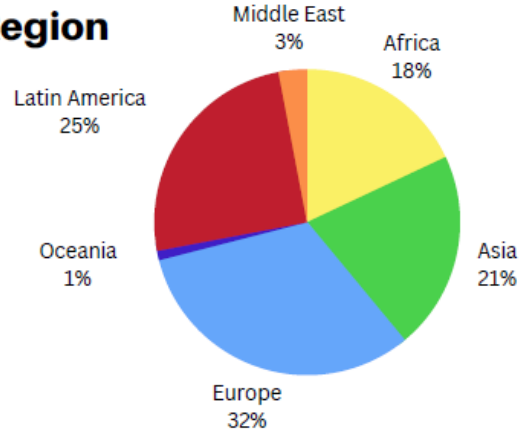

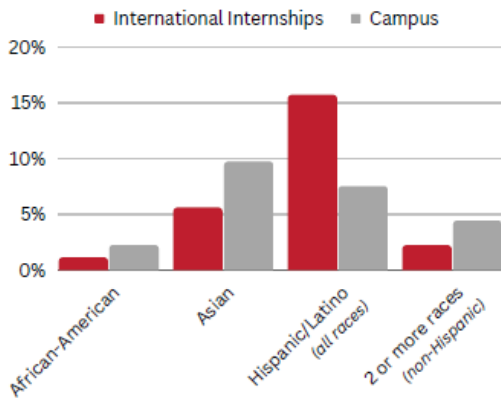


Region

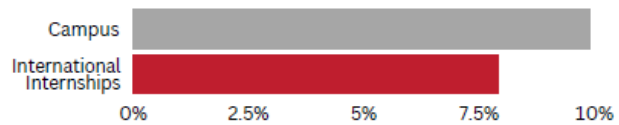


Racial/Ethnic Diversity

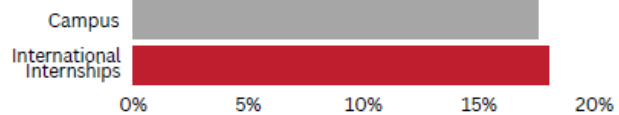
